11th Grade Summer Work

American Literature - Your American Literature summer work is attached to the same email as this document.

French II - Your French II summer work is attached to the same email as this document.

French IV - Your French IV summer work is attached to the same email as this document.

Spanish II - *Inca Safari* by Aubrey Smith-Carter and Addison Wesley 1995. There are Conjuguemos activities to practice the vocabulary from this reading: look for Sp 2, Inca Safari activities. Feel free to do any of the Conjuguemos activities beyond that. There will be a class-wide reward for 160 Conjuguemos activities successfully recorded among the class before September. That would be, for example, 5 people doing 4 activities a week through July and August.

Spanish III - Summer reading: *Easy Spanish Reader: A Three-Part Text for Beginning Students* by William T. Tardy, McGraw Hill 2015 --- Part I only; *Enrique y María*. Stop at *La historia de México*, the second part and third parts will be assigned in the future. There are Conjuguemos activities to practice the vocabulary from this reading. Look for “Sp3, Enrique y María” in the Conjuguemos list. Feel free to do any of the conjuguemos activities beyond that. There will be rewards in September for a total 200 Conjuguemos activities among the class (that would be about 4 a week per person in July and August).

Spanish IV - Summer reading: *Easy Spanish Reader A Three-Part Text for Beginning Students* by William T. Tardy, McGraw Hill 2015 --- Part 2 only, up to *La historia de México*, Part 3 will be used for future reading assignments. Of course, you are welcome to read Part 1 for extra practice. There are Conjuguemos activities to practice the vocabulary from this reading. Look for “Sp 4 *La historia de México*” in the Conjuguemos list. Feel free to do any of the conjuguemos activities beyond that. There will be rewards in September for a total of 200 Conjuguemos activities among the class (that would be a little over 4 a week per student in July and August).
