MIDDLE SCHOOL SUPPLY LIST

Students should have the following materials, many of which can stay at school in lockers.

Five 1-subject spiral notebooks OR one or two multi-subject notebooks, college-ruled or wide-ruled
Five folders with pockets
3-ring binder in which students can house notebooks or folders
One unlined sketchbook, any comfortable size to carry in your backpack on a daily basis
A 20" x 26" x 2" wallet portfolio for art class for 6th, 7th, 8th, and 9th grade students
One pad or book of graph paper (to be used during the second semester)
A scientific calculator that is not on a phone (Example: TI-30XIIS); graphing calculators (TI-84 Plus) will not be required until Algebra 2, but students can opt to gain comfort with them earlier.
Pencils, pens, highlighters
Pencil case or box
A small pencil sharpener
Backpack
Lunchbox/bag
Water bottle
Black athletic shorts and black soccer socks for students playing soccer
